## Workshops

C.S.P. Summer Workshops are programs designed for young people entering kindergarten through twelfth grades. They provide an opportunity for talented and creative students to experience live theatre. The participants will personally be involved in the dynamics of combined art forms, the challenges of creative self-expression and the appreciation of theatre as a major force in cultural development. All workshops and productions will be held in the Thomas A. Bruder Life Center and the

surrounding Neumann University campus facilities. Performances will be held in the 300-seat Fred P. Meagher Theatre.

### Sessions include:

**Acting...** Theatre games and exercises, stage directions and blocking.

**Movement...** A variety of dance and creative movements.

**Voice...** Vocal skills of speaking and singing.

**Stage...** Visual aspects of theatre including stage design, painting and theatrical make-up.
